A destination spot nestled along the shores of Wasaga Beach

At Stonebridge By the Bay, a charming beach-side community consisting of 353 homes in beautiful Wasaga Beach, there's something different going on.

It's easy to see that the developers are building gorgeous freeholds, bungalows and two-storey villas. And the discerning eye will notice that, at Stonebridge, designers took their cue from Wasaga Beach circa the 1920s — porches, gambrel roofs and other architectural highlights hint at the past.

But what's harder to see is just how hard these developers have worked to build a strong sense of community here. This sense of belonging, of ease, isn't really something you can see in a marketing brochure. It's something you feel.

Movies in the park, holiday festivities including a 20-foot Christmas tree, Canada Day celebrations with fireworks, a petting zoo and a midway show; there's always something going on at Stonebridge By the Bay.

And these events are in addition to the experiences waiting to be had at the private beach club, the outdoor salt water pool, the walking trails, the Zen garden, the climbing rock, the swings and the music pavilion overlooking

At Stonebridge's Town Centre — look for the beautiful stone entry gates — home owners will find everything their busy life requires: restaurants aplenty, all manner of retailers and professional and financial services. All within walking distance.

A new 23,907-square foot Wasaga Beach Public Library will soon occupy a 1.5-acre parcel adjacent to Stonebridge's community park. The library was proposed in 2002 by the Southern Ontario Library

Services (SOLS), an agency reporting to the provincial Ministry of Culture.

And it's all part of Mark Crowe's, a principal with Stonebridge Building Group, vision of creating a long-term sustainable centre. Of creating a destination.

"The addition of office space will bring people to the centre to work and cultural elements will bring people to the centre to learn, to be entertained, or for other special purposes," he explains.
